## Aoyama Gakuin Kindergarten



Aoyama Gakuin Kindergarten provides Christian early childhood education that nurtures each child to grow in the love and grace of God through Jesus Christ, while fostering a spirit of cooperation as individuals created by God.

The kindergarten offers a three-year program centered on play-based learning. The goals for each grade are “trust” (junior class), “joy” (middle class), and “gratitude” (senior class).

Through joyful play with friends, children develop trust in their teachers and in God. Through a variety of activities, including interactions with plants and animals, they gradually discover the joy of life and cultivate a sense of appreciation.

Aoyama Gakuin Elementary School provides education in the required subjects while respecting each student’s individuality and aptitude, without relying on numerical grading.

The school places great importance on daily life as an essential part of learning. For example, students develop healthy eating habits and table manners through shared meals in the dining hall.

Students also participate in a variety of overnight programs, such as a Christian camp, farm experience, long-distance swimming, and a cruise around Japan. These experiences are designed to foster responsibility and leadership, deepen friendships, and cultivate gratitude for Japan’s natural environment.

## Aoyama Gakuin Junior High School



Aoyama Gakuin Junior High School aims to develop students’ fundamental academic skills. To enhance understanding and broaden students’ interests, the school has adopted a subject-centered classroom system, in which specialized classrooms are designated for each subject.

Media spaces featuring subject-related books, displays, and students’ work are located adjacent to each classroom, along with preparation rooms for teachers. This learning environment encourages students to deepen their knowledge and curiosity in each subject area.

Another distinctive feature of the school is the elective courses offered to third-year students. A wide range of courses is available, including AI, Introduction to Cryptography, Film Production, Korean, Chinese, Haiku, and Calligraphy.

Aoyama Gakuin Senior High School offers a flexible and well-balanced curriculum that enables students to further develop the academic abilities they acquired in junior high school and to carve out their own paths in life.

Elective courses are offered from the second year, and by the third year about half of the curriculum consists of electives. This flexibility allows students to pursue their individual interests and prepare for their future goals.

While some graduates choose to enter other universities, approximately 85 percent continue on to Aoyama Gakuin University.

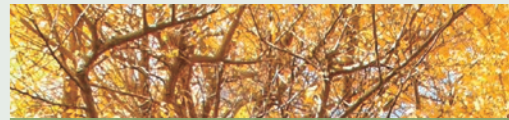
